- Our Rule as Code editor is translating tax rules into a machine-readable standard format (json), it can be done by pressing a button.
- Of course, it is not as simple as it sounds.




Coding tax regulations

- Interpretations upstream near the source (legislator)
- Huge societal gains no need translate legal language into IT
- Higher legal quality simpler and binary law interpretation
- Rules must be both machinereadable and human-readable
- Equal treatment & transparency even more important




Rule as Code-Editor – new tools for tax experts

- Under development collaboration between tax and IT experts
- As easy as writing legal supportive texts
- Decision trees converted to machine-readable files by pressing a button



- Able to test legal rules, logically, legally
 & programmability
- Aim share tool & rule engine as open source
